72 indicators inducing 3 assessment axis — from double-bind to spirituality

“Positive or approving adjectives; negative or disapproving adjectives”

Will to communicate with others

☞ Extraverted, introverted; talkative, quiet; confident, shy

How you make others feel

☞ Warm, cold; kind, unkind; sweet, nasty

How you treat the feelings of others people

☞ Considerate, inconsiderate; thoughtful, thoughtless; tactful, tactless

How much people might be able to trust you

☞ Trustworthy, untrustworthy; reliable, unreliable; loyal, disloyal

How honest you are with others

☞ Sincere, insincere; frank, secretive; direct, sneaky

How open you are to the views and culture of others

☞ Tolerant, intolerant; open-minded, narrow-minded; unbiased, biased

How motivated you are

☞ Strong-willed, weak-willed; determined, irresolute; driven, apathetic

Your attitude towards work

☞ Industrious, idle; ambitious, unambitious; hardworking, lazy

How good you are at learning and understanding

☞ Bright, foolish; clever, stupid; intelligent, unintelligent

How you treat money

☞ Generous, miserly; giving, mean; frugal, extravagant

You’re your attitude is around other people

☞ Humble, arrogant; modest, vain; submissive, bossy

How relaxed you are

☞ Chilled, tense; laid-back, uptight; optimistic, pessimistic
